SUBJECT: HOA Community Activities Coordinator

POSITION: The Board of Directors shall appoint a Woodlake Village resident as Community Activities Coordinator for a one-year term coinciding with the Annual Homeowner meeting held each March. HOA Directors shall not serve as Community Activities Coordinator, but one Director will be a liaison with the Community Activities Coordinator and Directors may host community events. At its discretion, the Board may appoint an assistant Community Activities Director.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Community Activities Coordinator duties and responsibilities include:

- Helping residents of the neighborhood organize and plan self-supporting social, cultural and special activities and events for the benefit of Woodlake Village residents and their guests.
- Maintaining the Village Voice Activities and events calendar by the 23rd of each month with the Village Voice

editor.

- Helping residents of the neighborhood plan, schedule and coordinate recurring monthly social activities, games and events.
 - Fees charged for the various activities and events will be set to cover all estimated expenses. There should be no accumulation of funds in excess of \$1,000.00. Any excess accumulation should be factored into the next community event pricing so as to keep income and expenses as equal as possible.
 - Provide residents of the neighborhood hosting or organizing social activities assistance in preparing for the event, use of kitchen equipment, post-event cleanup, posting notices and other related assistance.
 - Working with community volunteers to ensure scheduling, publicizing and hosting of the Newcomers Welcome party, to be held at least annually.
 - Helping resident sponsors of community activities in preparation and submission of financial reports including all cash collected from attendees and all funds expended for the activity including all appropriate receipts or other documentation.
 - Cooperate with the Treasurer in preparing financial Income and Expense Statement showing Operating Cash Balance, and financial records subject to three quarterly and one year end (12/31) annual audit of financial transactions by the Board Treasurer. A summary report will be published monthly in the Village Voice.
 - Use the separate board community activities bank account independent from the HOA operations account for deposits and expenditures for community activities. This account will require two signatures on all checks written. Signors on this account may include any member of the Board, the Activities coordinator, and any other person designated by the Board. The treasurer shall have full access to all records related to the account.
 - The person designated as the sponsor, host or organizer of an event will be responsible for:
 - A Determining what items, people, supplies, etc. are necessary for the event.
 - B Requesting in writing any disbursements that are necessary to be paid prior to the event.
 - C Maintaining detailed receipts for all expenditures.
 - D Collecting any cash and checks from those participating in the event and assisting in preparing a bank deposit for said funds. Expenses for the event may NOT be paid from the funds received for the event.
 - E Prepare a written report detailing number of participants (paid and unpaid), total funds received, and the description and amount of expenses paid.
 - F Request in writing any disbursements/reimbursements that are to be paid after the event.
 - G The above is to be submitted to the Activities Coordinator as soon as possible after the event.

ROULADE

SOUFFLE:

- 2 tbsp margarine
- 2 tbsp flour
- 1 ¼ cup 2% milk
- ¼ tsp salt
- ¼ tsp white pepper
- 12 eggs, separated
- 1½ cup flaked salmon (fresh or canned)
- OR 1 ½ cups grated cheese
- OR 1 ½ cups cooked diced chicken.

SAUCE:

- 2 tbsp margarine
- 2 tbsp flour
- 1 cup 2% milk
- 5 tbsp dry sherry
- ¼ tsp ground nutmeg
- ⅛ tsp dry mustard

FILLING:

- ½ cup diced onion
- 1 large tomato, seeded, diced
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- salt and pepper to taste

Melt margarine; stir in flour to make a roux. Gradually stir in milk and seasonings, cook until you have a smooth thickened sauce. Gradually stir in beaten yolks. Stir in the flaked salmon, cheese, chicken. Beat the egg whites until stiff, add sauce and gently fold together with a rubber spatula. Line a cookie sheet with wax paper; gently spread roulade mixture evenly in pan. Bake at 400F for about 15-20 minutes. When souffle mixture is browned and firm to the touch, remove from oven. Invert the cookie sheet onto a clean tea towel. Remove pan; gently pull away wax paper. Quickly roll up the hot souffle roll with the towel, let stand on the counter while you make the filling and sauce. Unroll and spread filling over top and re roll without towel. Serve at once on a heated platter with sauce over it or served alongside.
