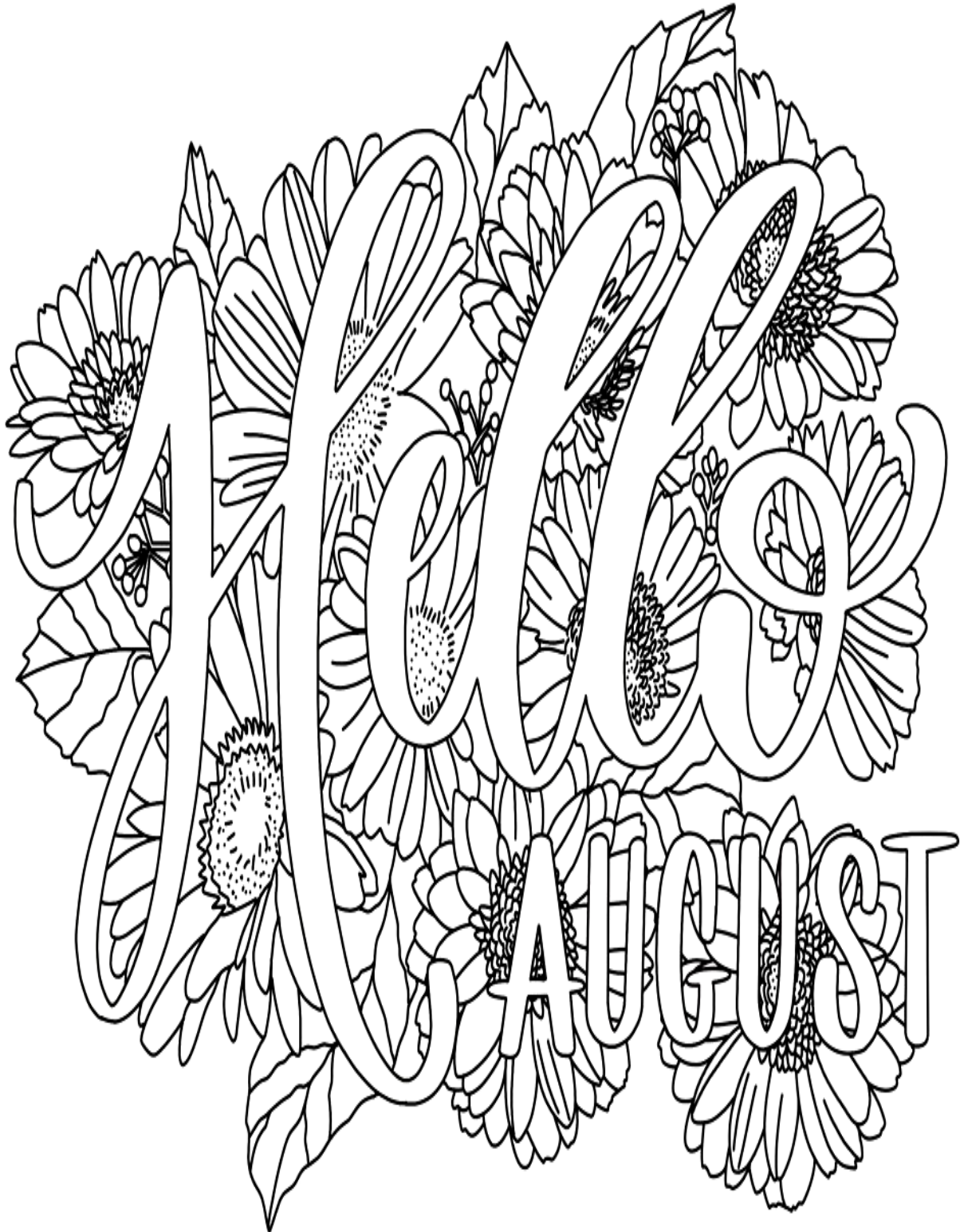

EARL'S VEGETARIAN STEW - Serves 6

- | | |
|------------------|-----------------------------|
| 2 tomatoes | 10 ounces frozen sweet peas |
| 2 potatoes | 1 teaspoon Tabasco sauce |
| 2 carrots | ½ cup brown rice, dry |
| 2 zucchini | ½ cup oil |
| 1 globe eggplant | ½ pound Jack cheese, grated |
| 1 onion | |

Preheat oven to 375°F. Cut vegetables in chunks. You don't need to peel them if you wash them well. Put all ingredients in a large casserole dish. Bake uncovered 1 to 1 ½ hours until all vegetables are tender. Spread cheese on top and mix into casserole.

You may use less oil and some water. In winter you can use canned tomatoes and use some of the juice. You may use frozen mixed vegetables instead of peas. This can be readily adapted depending on which vegetables are plentiful. The ingredient list is only a guide. Leave out the eggplant if your family doesn't care for it. You can use more squash. You can also use some fresh green beans.

NOTES : A baked rice and vegetable stew using your favorite combination of vegetables from the summer harvest; topped with Jack cheese.
